# MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 9th JANUARY 2017

302 **Resolved:** to approve the Minutes of the meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> January. Proposed by SW, seconded by AG. All in agreement.

## **MATTERS ARISING**

- Bates Flooring: have now visited the Village Hall and adjusted the flooring between the Hall and Committee Room. The expansion was greater than would be expected so a Techno Digital Gauge has been loaned short term to enable measurements to be taken temperature and humidity and address issues that may be resulting in the flooring expanding.
- Trod Footpath: a high-level figure to provide this footpath along the High Street is approx. £11,000; if an asphalt finish is required this will be an additional £12,000. To request from Highways more detailed figures and place on Agenda for March. Also agreed that the residents along the High Street to be consulted on this proposal as it will be outside their homes.
- Drainage works on High Street: following correspondence with G Freeman MP and Highways it has been confirmed that the work to the overflowing drain on the High Street will be completed within the current financial year. However, it was noted that to date the Highways Programme of Works on their website does not include this work and it is not clear if the necessary permits to carry out the work, close the road etc, have been applied for. If not, then the timescales provided would appear to be unrealistic.

# **HIGHWAYS**

309 Nothing to report.

## **PLANNING**

- 310 <u>2017/0001: Land off Morley Lane, Morley St. Botolphs</u>. Proposed anaerobic digestion renewable energy unit, landscaping and vehicular access and associated works. A range of objections were raised including:
  - The local road network is totally inadequate to cope with the size, frequency and speed (already an issue for many rural communities) from the likely high number of HGVs and agricultural vehicles that will be travelling to/from the site

- Conditions could be placed on traffic movements but how will these be enforced; it
  is to be expected that drivers will seek only the shortest, not the most appropriate,
  route
- The analysis of traffic movements appears to be spread evenly over a 12-month period but harvesting of crops is seasonal. Local knowledge is that the farmer often works throughout the night during harvest thereby greatly increasing traffic movements at certain times of the year
- This proposal will remove land from food production
- The appearance of the building in the open countryside will be detrimental to the visual rural environment
- There are no pedestrian footpaths in some of these villages thereby placing pedestrians of all ages at significant risk
- The impact on residential areas will be significant in terms of pollution: noise, smell, light and traffic
- The proposed site is very close to Grade I and II listing buildings and the suggestion of placing an industrial development so close to historic buildings is unacceptable and lacks any consideration for local heritage. Concerns have been raised by Historic England in this respect
- The Parish Council is not aware of any consultation exercise conducted on behalf of the Applicant although we understand that reference has been made that such a consultation may have taken place
- Many residents living close to the proposed site have received no notification from SNC about these plans should they have been informed?

Resolved: to object to this proposal for an anaerobic Digester

- 311 <u>2016/2842: Land north of 69 High Street</u>. Variation of Condition 1 on 2014/2337 (Reserved Matters) for erection of 14 dwellings seeking approval of access, appearance, scale, landscaping and layout House Type change on Plot 13. No views or comments.
- 312 To note the following decisions by SNC on Planning Applications:
  2016/2811. 43 High Street, demolition of single storey bathroom and kitchen and replace with two storey extension. Approval with Conditions

### **PLAYING FIELD**

commencing 13<sup>th</sup> February). Again, all users have been informed and will be moving their equipment into the Bowls Club during this period.
