# NCC Report for December meetings

Norfolk County Council received £635,000 from the Social Input Board for a four year project to reduce homelessness and promote independence. The fund can also be used to support people who are at risk of becoming homeless and will support the Adult Social Care aim of 'no homelessness in Norfolk'.

With funding from DWP Norfolk County Council also launched Norfolk COVID Winter Help to support those facing financial hardship over the winter period. #### Fire Service

The Fire Service is working with the Police on a Drink/Drug Drive campaign called #IMPACT to highlight the dangers and protect other road users. There will be three mock crashed car scenes outside the Fire Stations in King's Lynn, Thetford and Sprowston to show the outcome of driving accidents and to make people more aware of the need to drive carefully.

As we are coming to a time when people have more candles and electrical items in their homes the Fire Service are also promoting Test it on Tuesday to try to get people in the habit of testing their fire alarms.
